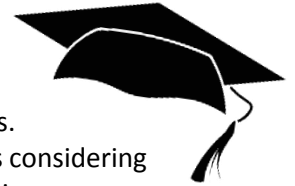

Train to Teach Event- Wednesday 21st February 2018, 4.30pm - 6.30pm

TeachSlough currently has excellent training opportunities for teaching, both in primary and secondary schools. This evening is for anyone who is considering training to teach, including teaching assistants, career changers, qualified teachers looking to return to teaching, as well as teachers trained overseas, and those graduating in the summer of 2018.



If you are interested in finding out more about getting into primary / secondary school teaching, come along to meet:

- Specialist mentors from our partnership schools as well as from other local training partnerships;
- University of Reading tutors.

TeachSlough School Direct Teacher Training is provided in Slough Partnership schools, working together with the University of Reading. All courses lead to Qualified Teacher Status. You can also opt to do the PGCE course, which leads to 60 Masters credits.

You may be eligible for a salaried place, or a bursary.

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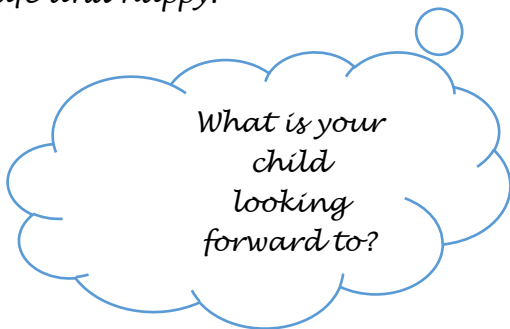

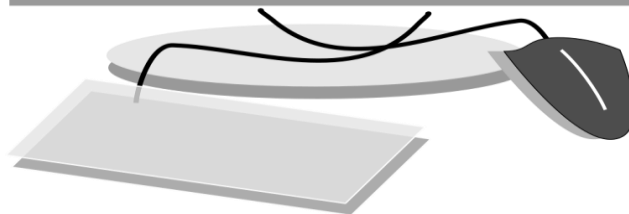
