

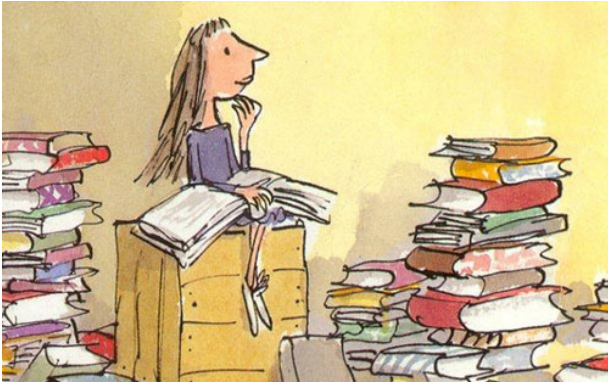

Please be aware: There is an 80% probability of severe cold weather/icy conditions/heavy snow between 09:00 Friday 23<sup>rd</sup> February and 12:00 Monday 26<sup>th</sup> February. The weather for Southeast England follows:

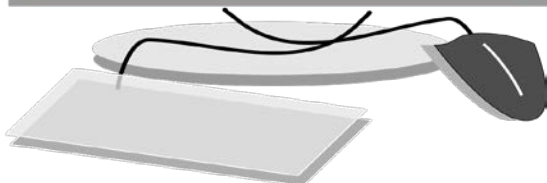
