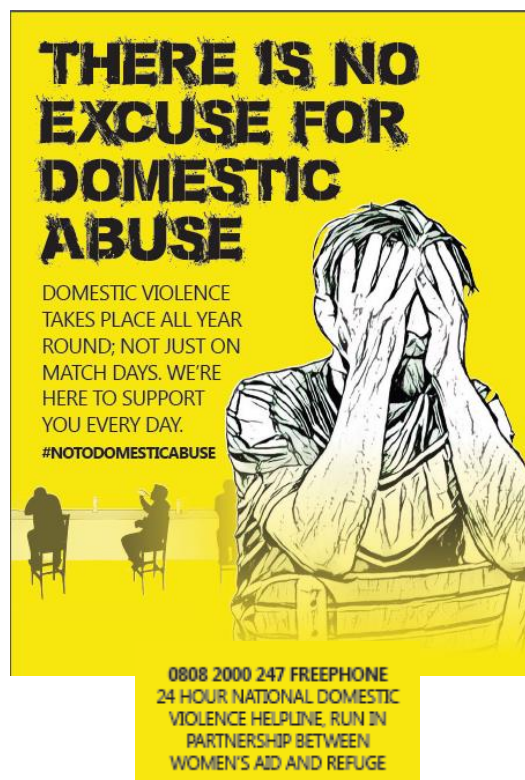

Domestic Abuse and the Football World Cup

Sadly, when there are major football tournaments, incidents of domestic violence increase.

Researchers at Lancaster University studied incidents of domestic abuse during World Cup matches in 2002, 2006 and 2010 and found a 38 per cent rise on days when the England team played and lost, and a 26 per cent rise when England won or drew.

In 2016, the BBC Radio 4's Thinking Allowed programme also covered this issue and spoke to Jodie Swallow, from the University of Chester, about her research. She explained "My study revealed that women endured a range of harms, including physical, sexual and economic abuse, as well as coercive and controlling behaviours. While the abuse wasn't limited to sport, sport was a means through which their fanatical partners exerted power and maintained control over them."
